Objectives/Outcomes

- Explain why I like something and why I don't like something


Introduction (APK)

Meet the Artist

Natalie Sappier-Samaqani Cocahq (The Water Spirit) creator of "We are Home"

Information – Who, What, When

- ✓ Identify the artist
- ✓ What is the title of the work?
- ✓ When was it completed?
- ✓ How does this information broaden your interpretation of the work? How?



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Describe it – The Elements of Art

When looking at “We are Home”, students will be asked to describe;

- ✓ What kinds of things do you see in this artwork?
- ✓ How would you describe the lines in this artwork? The shapes? The colours? What does this artwork show?
- ✓ How would you describe the people in this picture? Are they like you or different?
- ✓ How would you describe (the place depicted in) this artwork?
- ✓ How would you describe this artwork to a person who could not see it?

The Instruction

Create your own “We are Home”

Students will create a piece of art based on the geometric shapes found in “We are Home”.

Goal: to facilitate Students’ personal relationship with creative arts and provide a personal context through which to connect more deeply to a creative work.

Closure/Assessment (*this can be completed with an exit ticket, journal writing or class discussion*)


- ✓ What elements of the art work “We are Home” do you like and dislike? Why?

- ✓ What do you think is worth remembering about this art work?
